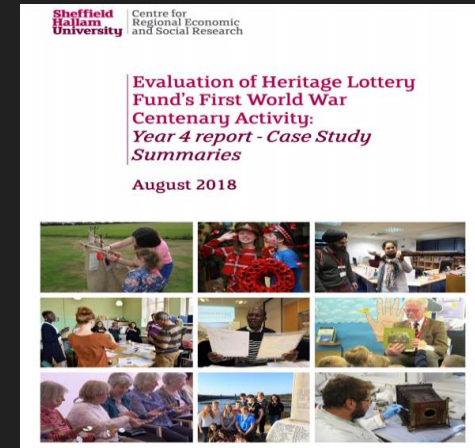


First World War Centenary - Locality

- HLF awarded over £94 million to more than 1,900 projects between 2010 - 2018, including around 1,400 projects funded through the 'FWW: Then and Now' programme.
- At least one project took place in 95% of the UK's local authorities.
- Overall 57% of projects were in the more deprived 50% of areas in England, 62% in Scotland and 50% in Wales.
- Young people under 16 and older people over 60 were particularly well represented within projects.
- 90% of projects worked with volunteers. Most (76%) projects led community events, while large proportions also put on talks from FWW experts or delivered workshops (60%) with heritage organisations such as museums, libraries, archives or local history societies (52%).
- In 2018, 57% of projects produced project websites, 28% made films and 38% put on performances, alongside more traditional media such as creating leaflets or exhibition displays.

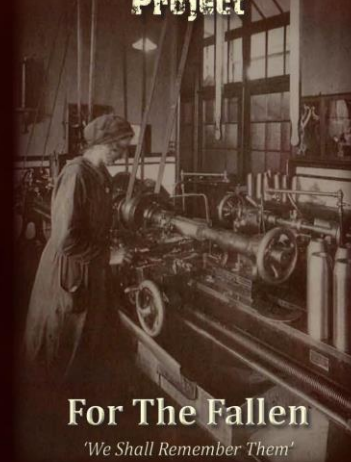
